■ **Sept. 3 in East Grand Forks:** PeatMoss & The Spreaders will perform at

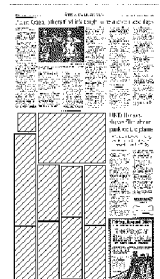
